## February Super Trip

Submarines and Ferry Boats and Passenger Vans and Bicycles....

It's time for another great Scouting adventure! This time it's a journey to the outer reaches of Georgia...from one corner to another. It all happens President's Day weekend. (*sign-up **deadline** and parent information meeting is **FEB 5th**!!*) Here is a quick summary of our itinerary.

We start on Friday February 15<sup>th</sup>, loading up at 5pm into passenger vans. First stop is the Macon area for our first night in the "wild".

With an early start on Saturday, we hope to see some USAF craft of all kinds outside the Museum of Aviation. But there's no time to loiter as we must hit the road to get to the sea. We make it just in time for an "up close and personal" view of the **USS Georgia** (SSGN 729) at its new home base at Kings Bay Naval Station!! Yes, a real, live, nuclear powered, guided missile submarine named after the 4th state in the Union!! After a few hours trying to find the missile launch codes (just kidding), it's off to tour a bit of the base. We will worship on Saturday evening...maybe in the base Chapel. Then dinner, bowling, and a night's rest in the TVQ (Navy lingo for a bath and bed).

Go to sleep fast, because we are up early the next morning to catch a ferry for Cumberland Island (it's the only way to get there) home of numerous armored pigs (armadillos), "ranger-trained" raccoons, otters, and wild horses. The island, dense with palmetto and live oaks, was home of the Thomas Carnegie family back in the late 1800s. The ruins of their home and even older buildings are there for touring. We'll spend the day checking out the island, playing on the beach, and just generally having a good time. For our last night out, we hit Jekyll Island campground a few miles up the road after the ferry takes us back to the mainland.

That's a lot to do in a couple of days, so Monday will be the time to do what every Scout loves – **FREE TIME** – on Jekyll Island. We can hike the nature trails, hit the beaches, ride bikes, just hang out, or even work on Scout skills. After a full day of "nothing", we're back on the road again for the drive back home, arriving by 8pm. Since Tuesday is a school day for some, we can't be too late.
