Congratulations to our New Eagle Scouts!

On October 23, 2008, Troop 317 proudly announced their newest Eagle Scouts. This honor was awarded to **Matthew Barker**, **Michael Barker** and **Gavin Brand**. Eagle Scout is the highest rank attainable in the Boy Scouting program of the Boy Scouts of America. Since its introduction in 1911, the Eagle Scout rank has been earned by more than 1.7 million young men. The title of Eagle Scout is held for life, thus giving rise to the phrase "Once an Eagle, always an Eagle".

Requirements include earning at least 21 merit badges and demonstrating Scout spirit, service, and leadership. This includes an extensive leadership service project that the Scout plans, organizes, leads, and manages. Eagle Scouts are presented with a medal and a badge that visibly recognizes their accomplishments.

Margin in Physical Energy

As part of the Troop 317 discipleship curriculum we cover three primary themes over the course a Scouting year (August through June). In November, January and February of each year we will discuss ideas related to being "an effective manager of life, relationships and resources." This set we will be learning about the concept of margin as discussed in Dr. Richard Swenson's book Margin.

The concept of margin can be viewed as a formula: **Power – Load = Margin**. "Power" is made up of factors such as skills, time, emotional strength, physical strength, spiritual vitality, finances, social supports and education. Subtract from that "Load" which combines internal factors – such as personal expectations and emotional disabilities – and external factors – such as school, problems or responsibilities in relationships, and our involvement in groups such as Scouts. When our "Load" is greater than our "Power," the result of this formula is negative margin or "Overload." When our "Power" is greater than our "Load", we have "Margin."

This month's theme is "Margin In Physical Energy". Here are some passages of Scripture to meditate on related to this month's theme: Psalm 18:2, Psalm 18:32-33, Colossians 1:29, Mark 2:23-27, 1 Tim 4:8, and Mark 6:30-32.
