

Troop Bugler

Introduction: By accepting the position of Troop Bugler, you agree to provide service and leadership to your troop. The responsibility should be fun and rewarding. This job description outlines some of the things you are expected to do while serving in this leadership role.

Advisor/Adult Mentor: Program Coordinator / Campmaster / Assistant Scoutmaster

Reports to: Assistant Senior Patrol Leader

Specific Duties:

- Attend Patrol Leaders' Meetings
- Learn and practice appropriate bugle calls
- Sound appropriate bugle calls at troop campouts
- Sound appropriate bugle calls at weekly meetings.
- Set a good example.
- Wear the uniform correctly.
- Live by the Scout Oath and Law.

Participate in a conference with your advisor midway through your tenure to discuss and evaluate your responsibilities and the performance of your duties. You can always have a conference with your advisor at any time. If you feel like having a discussion, just ask.

Resources: As Troop Bugler, there are many resources available to you to help you do your job. These include people such as your Scoutmaster, ASM's, Troop Committee Members, and other Scouts. Other resources include teachers, religious leaders, community leaders, and fellow junior leaders. There is also literature available, some of which is in the Troop Library.
